- HONORING OUR VIETNAM VETERANS by highlighting the memorials, memorabilia and remembrances of each area that surrounds our AVVA/VVA chapters as we travel up CA state. Please view the link above, the PowerPoint will give you an illustration of the Veteran highlights in the San Diego community. AVVA/VVA Chapter 472 is located in the corresponding area.
- **INCREASING MEMBERSHIP** by encouraging and assisting further participation with the Universities near the corresponding chapters. Chapter 472 is located in the vicinity of the University of CA San Diego. UC San Diego features a thriving Students Veterans Organization (SVO). Thus, increasing the possibility of fortifying AVVA with younger members. Moreover, chapter participation with corresponding universities will increase the opportunity for fundraisers with assistance from the SVO's. The University of CA Chico Campus works closely with Chapter 582 on fundraisers. Hence, both parties involved in this endeavor share the brainpower, the demographics, and funds.

- **INCREASING FUNDS** by the following ideas:
 - *Incorporating your chapter* or state will give you the ability to solicit donations, and to raise your own funds. AVVA is a 501(C)3, which means your donors will be able to claim donations as a deduction on their taxes.
 - *Implementing a short-term method* by approaching your AVVA or VVA Chapter (whoever has more finances, usually VVA) and petitioning them for a donation or a percentage of the household income. This seed money allows your chapter to build additional relationships from with to garner contributions within the community. This assistance will also give your chapter time to establish a grant writing process that has the potential to gather larger donations. The SVO may have a grant writer within their group or may be able to refer you to someone with this ability.
 - *Approaching your local merchants,* corporations, civic organizations, and businesses through the abilities of presentations, grant writing and relationships to request donations.
