What a nice gift! I gifted Kleen Kanteens to my tour and hospitality guides, AVVA Utah Chapter Vice President Judy Kent, AVVA Utah Dual Member VVA Vice President, Chapter 1079 Don McCoach, and Director at Large, AVVA Utah Dual Member and 2nd Vice President to the President, Dennis Howland.

The moment I let Judy know that I had arrived at the hotel, they whisked me off to Applebee's to meet some of the AVVA and VVA Chapter Members. At the restaurant they let me know that a tour was scheduled for the next day at the Layton Vietnam Memorial. At the Memorial, I was greeted by Judy, Don, Dennis, and the Warrior Dog group. They say pictures say a thousand words!!!



Layton City's Vietnam Memorial is 85% of the Washington DC Memorial. Dennis Howland is pivotal in leading Utah Chapter 1079 AVVA, VVA and their community in completing this amazing memorial. Approximately three tours a week take place which include students and others. Sometimes a tour will be coordinated with a jet flyover. VVA Vice President Don said his flyover was a duck \mathfrak{S}

When Dennis does a project, he has a vision for the big picture and the details. Dennis was asked by student why the fallen Vietnam Soldiers did not get to keep their medals. Dennis answered that the medals were given to the family members. However, Dennis started thinking of the student's question and decided to open one of the panels and drop his medals inside as a symbolic gesture for all the names on the wall.

Included in the Layton Vietnam Memorial Site is the Vietnam War Dog Memorial. "When the United States pulled the military out of Vietnam at the end of the war, 4,000 Military Working Dogs (MWDs) were left in country. Many were euthanized, and the fate of the remaining ones was grim. The VVA members want this War Dog statue at the Wall to remember and honor those dogs left in Vietnam, and to acknowledge the grief the handlers felt as they left their K9 partners in Vietnam."

Warrior Dog, MAZZIE (no longer with us) served in Kuwait and modeled for the Memorial Statue. Warrior Dog GELI is shown in the pictures above and served in Kuwait for 4 years. The parents of GELI are Jim and Linda Crismer.



After the wonderful tour, the evening was scheduled for the Grand Presentation of the Incorporation Charter for the AVVA Chapter.

The AVVA Utah Chapter 1079 Team led by AVVA President Judy Kent worked extraordinarily hard in incorporating their Chapter. The process for Incorporating an AVVA Chapter takes endurance and dedication. However, the Incorporation process for this Chapter had additional twists and turns to the process. AVVA Chair Bobbie Morris navigated the way through the incorporation course, Judy Kent picked up the reins and led her Chapter to success.

CELEBRATION OF VETERANS DAY AT THE WALL – Nov. 10th was hosted by Vietnam Veterans for Veterans to commemorate the 40th Anniversary of *The Wall.* in Washington, DC. The rain took a break for the main event and my husband, Butch Frederickson, CA State Council North District Director is appreciating the significance of the event. A VVA sponsored reception followed the event at VVA National Headquarters.



"Prior to *The Wall* ceremony, VVA has sponsored a "Massing of the Colors" in honor of the 40th Anniversary of *The Wall*. Color guards from chapters and state councils across the country will join us in a salute to those we lost and those of us still surviving...."

"On Veteran's Day, Vietnam Veterans of America acted as the official host of the 69th Veterans Day National Commemoration at Arlington Cemetery, beginning with the wreath-laying ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, followed by an observance in the amphitheater with a parade of colors by veterans' organizations. The ceremony honored all who served in the United States Armed Forces."

VA National Veterans Day Observance

"The Veterans Day National Ceremony is held each year on November 11th at Arlington National Cemetery. The ceremony commences precisely at 11:00 a.m. with a wreath laying at the Tomb of the Unknowns and continues inside the Memorial Amphitheater with a parade of colors by veterans' organizations and remarks from dignitaries. The ceremony is intended to honor and thank all who served in the United States Armed Forces." Theme was "HONOR."

VVA PRESIDENT MCMANUS MANDATE – was expressed during a VVA general session of the Nov. 2022 BOD meeting. The Mandate consisted of sharing as many Vietnam Veteran's Stories with as many young people as possible in the next few years.

AVVA BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING, Nov. $8^{th} - 11th$ was held in Silver Springs, Maryland. I was invited to present the *TAKING AVVA TO THE NATION* project to the Board of Directors (BOD) Meeting.
